Recognition:

One of the best parts of writing my monthly President's Report is including recognition for all the good things CUF members and friends are doing for our Fellowship and the wider community. There are lots of things to note this month.

• CUF has always been a dedicated supporter of the Carbondale Warming Center. Lead by Jerry Molumby, CUF members have regularly provided meals for the Center. On February 25 a team from CUF participated in the "Coldest Night of the Year" international fundraising walk to benefit homeless shelters such as the Warming Center. The CUF team, the "Wuulkers," captained by Jeletta Brant, raised \$2750 out of the total raised locally of \$29,846. The Wuulkers placed third among the 33 local teams and 39th nationally among all 575 teams. Thanks to all who were part of the Wuulkers team and to all who gave to the event.

• The pandemic gave rise to so many changes for all of us and at CUF. One of those changes was a new and fun way to send Valentine wishes to family and friends and also raise some money for CUF. This year's version of the event was called "Songs for a Sweetie." For a \$5 donation people could send Valentine greetings with a "love" song sung by one of our great CUF musicians! CUF raised \$105 and lots of people got a low calorie, environmentally thoughtful and very sweet gift. Thanks to Candy Davis and Glenn McLernon for handling the requests as well as for singing. And thanks to all the other singers

including TeeKae Kelly, Bob Swenson, Marty Merrill, Elana Floyd-Kennett, Warren Bush, and Ginivra Herr.

- Each year the Social Action Team holds several food drives for food banks and charities in our area. The first food drive of 2023 was held in February. We collected a lot of food items for the Murphysboro Food Pantry which serves all of Jackson County. Thanks to everyone who donated to this drive and to the RE kids for helping to load all the food into the car to deliver to the Food Pantry.
- One of the recently formed groups at CUF is the Reproductive Justice Discernment Group (RJDG). The RJDG organized CUF's first action to support the new Choices Clinic in Carbondale and its patients. Working with other local faith communities, RJDG assembled care packages for patients with items donated by the CUF community. Youth from the Church of the Good Shepherd joined in the "assembly line" to prepare the packages. Thanks to the RJDG for doing this important work and to all who donated items and helped with the project.
- The Survivor Empowerment Center held its annual Taste of Chocolate fundraiser on February 10. CUF was a sponsor of this event and placed an ad in the program recognizing the contributions of CUF members Joyce Webb and Martha Shum to the Center. In 1972, Joyce was one of the "Founding Mothers" of what was, until recently, called the "Women's Center." Martha recently retired as Assistant Director of the Center after 14 years of service. Thanks to these two CUF members who made a real difference in our community.
- As part of CUF's VoteLove 2023 effort, led by Bill Sasso, leading up to the April 4 local election there was a "brainstorming" meeting at CUF after the service on Sunday, February 19. Since then, information about the election has been offered at a table in the Commons. - CUF hosted another Red Cross Blood Drive on February 20 cosponsored with the Rotary Club of Carbondale and the NAACP. Coordinated by Jerry Molumby, this regular activity represents an important CUF contribution to our wider community.
- After the "Coldest Night of the Year" fundraising walk on February 25, CUF hosted another "Game Night." Thanks again to Sage Banks and Laura Basanta for getting this fun activity off the ground.
